WHAT IS FOSTER CARE?

Foster care involves providing a safe and

nurturing home for a specified and agreed

amount of time for people between 0 and 18 years-old who can't live with their biological parents.

There are basically five types of foster caring:

respite - when carers require a break,

usually for short periods (e.g. weekends)

emergency - when there are concerns for

a young person's immediate safety. Provided

It's up to you how much time your family

for a few nights, weeks or years. Whatever type of care works for you, your help will always be valued. Why do children need fostering? Right now, there are more than 20,000

kids in NSW who cannot live with their

birth families. The reasons for that include

physical, emotional and/or sexual abuse, neglect, drug or alcohol use, depression or family breakdown. All of these children have experienced the difficult loss and often painful separation from their birth family. CASPA is looking for committed people who can offer a safe and stable home to children
